Transition Services for Students with Disabilities

1. What is Vocational Rehabilitation's Transition Program?
Vocational Rehabilitation provides a Transition Program for high school students with disabilities, typically sixteen (16) years of age or older. VR staff work with the students to assist in preparing for life after high school, including planning for post-secondary education and/or employment. Transition services include activities and supports designed to assist the youth in identifying his or her interests and strengths and developing the skills needed to be successful in employment and independent living. 2. How long does Vocational Rehabilitation provide transition services to students with disabilities?
Students with disabilities may participate in the VR Transition Program until they graduate from high school. They may continue to receive services and support through the VR Adult Employment Program if eligibility continues after graduation.
